# 1. Actions from previous calls:

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# - Marek to check again with his colleagues concerned as to whether the # current proposal based on DHCP option 15 is acceptable.

An interesting discussion was had about reducing the scope to exclude the form of the configuration data. Whilst it is important to ensure that all the items identified so far are configurable, it may not be necessary to wait until a universal format is agreed. In the meantime, completing the work on the discovery and initial configuration acquisition should be considered a high priority.

Action: Eric to re-ask the question in one month.

Action: All to consider whether a prototype implementation can be made for their products on a timescale that might suit the next SIPit meeting (Oct/Nov?).
